LANGUAGE ACTUALIZATION. LITERATURE AND JAVA CULTURE IN SEDAYU BANTUL DISTRICT

ABSTRACT

The Community Service Program activity was held based on the request of the Sedayu sub-district government officials in order to pioneer tourism villages. Based on the situation analysis, the following problems are known: (1) the government officials and members of the youth group find it difficult to use the Javanese language between the various Ngoko and Krama for official communication and traditional ceremonies; (2) government officials and youth members find it difficult to read and write Javanese script; (3) cultural stakeholders in Sedayu Subdistrict have difficulty pioneering tourism villages according to local wisdom and regional potential; and (4) fostering and packaging macapat performances as assets of tourist villages. Following up on the problem, the PPM team of the Regional Language Education Department of FBS UNY held an actualization of language, literature, and Javanese culture in Sedayu sub-district. PPM activities have been carried out smoothly in the Sedayu District hall. The results of this activity are: first, the PPM team seeks to introduce Javanese language, literature and culture to the younger generation and the general public in Sedayu sub-district through actualization of Javanese language, literature and culture in Sedayu sub-district. The training is carried out by providing Javanese language material that is suitable for uploading to communicate officially in the Sedayu sub-district environment. Training on writing Javanese script was also given in order to pioneer tourism villages in Sedayu by utilizing a Javanese script computerization program to write place names, street names, alley names, and building names in Sedayu sub-district. The activity was attended by 25 participants enthusiastically to completion. Second, the FBS UNY Regional Language Education Department seeks to increase the interest of the community and the younger generation to develop and preserve Javanese art and culture through cooperation in organizing training on the macapat in the performance as a pilot village in Sedayu sub-district. This has been agreed upon by both parties and will be implemented as a form of continued PPM by 2020.
