

# **FIRST AID TRAINING IN INJURY (PPC) FOR STUDENTS OF PROSPECTIVE FOREIGN WORKERS AT LPK KENSHIN GLOBALINDO DIY**

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## **ABSTRACT**

Occupational Health and Safety (K3) is an effort to create a safe, comfortable working atmosphere and achieve the goal of highest productivity. Occupational Health and Safety is very important to implement in all fields of work without exception in building construction projects such as apartments, hotels, malls and others, because the application of K3 can prevent and reduce the risk of accidents or illness due to work. The purpose of community service activities in general is to conduct training and assistance on Occupational Health and Safety for students at LPK Kenshine Globalindo, Bantul Regency, Yogyakarta. The specific objectives of this technical guidance activity are: (1) Increasing the understanding and ability of students at LPK Kenshine Globalindo on Occupational Health and Safety, (2) Increasing knowledge and understanding of the importance of implementing Occupational Health and Safety for overseas workers, (3) Increasing the knowledge and understanding of students at LPK Kenshine Globalindo regarding health and handling injuries due to work accidents.

In order for the PKM activity program to take place as targeted, it is necessary to apply several methods, including through lecture, discussion and demonstration methods as well as with assistance. The lecture contains material related to Health delivered by Dr. Widiyanto, M.Kes and first aid material delivered by Dr. Tri Ani Hastuti, M.Pd along with the demonstration materials.

The results of this community service activity can be summarized as follows: (1) Based on direct observation it shows that the motivation of the participants to actively participate in the activity is very good, this can be seen from the discussions and questions raised by the participants to the resource persons, (2) Some Most of the participants dared to display and discuss the creative results of developing a case-based injury management model, (3) Most of the participants were able to apply the creative results of developing a case-based injury management model, and (4) At the end of this activity, participants were asked to compile and collect their work in the form of properly case-based injury handling videos.
