

Spatial Perspective of Subjective Well-being: A comparative study between Indonesia and Malaysia

ABSTRACT

This study aims to examine the spatial factors of spatial subjective well-being in Indonesia and Malaysia. We used data from National surveys, such as National Social Economic Survey (SUSENAS) and Indonesia Family Life Survey (IFLS), are used to measure subjective well-being in Indonesia, while World Values Survey of Malaysia was used to look at subjective well-being in Malaysia. Multilevel modeling is used to answer research questions. The results show that well-being has different spatial distribution both in Indonesia and Malaysia.
