

BEST PRACTICE TRAINING FOR INDONESIAN, JAVA, AND FOREIGN LANGUAGE TEACHERS IN SMA AND PRIVATE VOCATIONAL SCHOOL IN YOGYAKARTA SPECIAL REGION

ABSTRACT

This regional development PPM is a PPM that is intended to help partner problems, namely how language teachers who have interesting teaching experiences in the Covid-19 Pandemic era are able to express their experiences appropriately in the form of a best practice format. This was chosen because many best practice competitions were held and motivated teachers to be even better at teaching.

The purpose of this activity is to train language teachers, namely Indonesian, Javanese, and Foreign (English) in SMA and Private Vocational Schools throughout DIY in developing best practice language learning in their respective schools. For this reason, teachers are able to choose which "teaching achievements" deserve to be appointed as best practice, able to follow best practice procedures, and able to make best practice reports.

The target audience are Indonesian, Javanese, and English teachers in SMA and SMK throughout DIY. Researchers collaborated with MGMP LP Ma'arif NU PWNU DIY, and selected 120 teachers into 35 teachers in 2 stages. PPM is carried out for 4 months, starting from July 11 to November 21, 2020. The meeting was held 4 times with the addition of servants with MGMP according to their field of study. The methods used include lectures, demonstrations, questions and answers, assignments, practices, mentoring, and re-implementation to strengthen the best practice process.

PPM accomplishes several things. First, the product target is achieved. More than 80% of the participants were able to define the problem, implement, and make a report. However, only 60.6% of the participants were able to present their work. The evaluation of meaningfulness showed that the PPM materials were meaningful to them, quite clear, and they expressed satisfaction. The PPM process also went well according to the results of observations and a google form questionnaire.
