Pembuatan Bangunan Pelengkap Pendopo di Kawasan Bumi Perkemahan Gendungan, Desa Kalibening, Kecamatan Dukun, Kabupaten Magelang

ABSTRACT

Tourism is one of the industries that is growing rapidly in Indonesia and has been proven to contribute large amounts of income. Tourism will continue to develop in line with the development of industrialization and changes in lifestyle, which cause people to increasingly have the ability to travel and have more time to travel, especially to Indonesia.

Kalibening Village, Dukun District, Magelang Regency, Central Java, is one of the tourist villages in the area located under the slopes of Mount Merapi. Kalibening Village is located approximately 50 km from Yogyakarta City, or approximately ±15 km from Magelang City. For the most part, the livelihoods of the people of Kalibening Village are those of farmers who cultivate the land for farming paddy fields. Paddy fields are a place for farming for local communities and are the main source of livelihood for some local communities. Kalibening Village offers a new experience: living in a village with rural nature, breathing fresh air, being far from pollution and noise, and experiencing and being involved in local community activities, in the sense that tourists don't just see the beauty of nature but can live in it. Tourists can fully experience and enjoy the natural and social culture of the village. Based on these considerations, the service team from the Department of Civil Engineering Education and Planning at FT UNY agreed to carry out lecturer activities outside campus, which is the realization of IKU 3 related to lecturer service in villages in the Taman Sari Tourism Area, Kalibening Village. One way is to build a complementary building to the pavilion. The complementary building is in the form of a pavilion wall. This construction is planned to be carried out on one side of the pavilion. The aim is to facilitate users, in this case, local residents, when carrying out outreach activities or presentations. It is hoped that this activity can support the Kalibening village program in order to establish Kalibening Tourism Village, Dukun District, Magelang Regency as a tourism village.
