Workshop on improving the role of family and community to optimize the growth and development of children aged 0-6 years in Mulyodadi Kraton Village, Bambanglipuro, Bantul

ABSTRACT

The community service Program (PPM) was conducted based on requests from partners and based on the results of needs analysis showed that in Mulyodadi Village Bantul did not have a good understanding related to the growth and development of children aged 0-6 years. This is the Golden Age. Therefore, a workshop was held to improve the role of family and community in order to optimize the growth and development of children aged 0-6 years in Mulyodadi Kraton Village, Bambanglipuro, Bantul. The target audience of this activity amounted to 30 people consisting of parents with children aged 0-6 years, posyandu cadres, and village administrators Mulyodadi Kraton. The activity stage begins with a request from a partner, then followed up with a needs assessment, after finding what is needed, providing material on the characteristics of early childhood, obstacles that can be found in early childhood, parenting for early childhood, and making parenting programs for early childhood. Measurement of success is done with a questionnaire-shaped instrument with pretest and posttest related material level of understanding of the growth and development of early childhood. Indicators of success used is the formulation of village programs on Early Childhood Care and evaluation of understanding and skills of the target audience increases.

The result of this PPM is the availability of village and cadre work programs regarding early childhood care and the success of increasing the understanding of participants related to Early Childhood Care Materials. The various supporting factors for the implementation of this PPM program are: 1) requests from partners 2)enthusiastic and active participants in the program 3) the cohesiveness of the PPM team in drafting and implementing PPM activities from the planning process, implementation, to final evaluation. The factor inhibiting the implementation of this PPM is that many participants bring their toddlers so that they are not optimal in following the activity.
