## Nasionalisme dan Liberalisme dalam Tiga Puisi William Wordsworth

## **ABSTRACT**

This research aims at investigating the themes of nationalism and liberalism in William Wordsworth's three poems, 'Thoughts of a Briton on the Subjugation of Switzerland', 'Britons and Freedom' and 'Written in London.' Genetic Structuralism was applied to reveal how the historical and social aspects, as well as the thoughts in the era when the poems were created, contribute to the expressions reflecting the ideas of nationalism and liberalism in the three poems. This research also reveals Wordsworths's views and perspectives on those ideas. Nationalism in Britain from the end of the eighteenth century to the beginning of the nineteenth century was a unique mixture of historical, cultural, social and political aspects. This research is expected to be able to explain how the complexity of the factors previously mentioned is represented in the expressions related to the ideas of nationalism and liberalism in the three poems being investigated. In doing so, this research used qualitative analytical method by paying a careful attention to the expressions related to the topics of nationalism and liberalism in the three poems. Meanwhile, triangulation technique was applied to improve the reliability of research results.
