TRAINING ON THE PREPARATION OF NON COGNITIVE ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENTS AND ITS ANALYSIS USING THE MODERN TEST THEORY APPROACH (IRT) FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL TEACHERS IN INDONESIA AND MALAYSIA

ABSTRACT

The development of technology and science in this century is also inseparable from the era of the industrial revolution 4.0. As time goes by, technological developments are increasingly rapid and advanced so that human resources (HR) need to improve their quality. One of the ways to improve the quality of human resources is through education. This is supported by the Education Act 1996 which explains that education is an ongoing effort to develop a holistic and balanced individual's potential. Therefore, this education can be started from an early age or Basic Education. Basic education is the main and important foundation in the world of education.
