COMPLETION OF INHERITANCE AMONG THE MIDDERS OF BATAKTOBADI, YOGYAKARTA SPECIAL REGION

ABSTRACT

This research aims to describe the settlement of inheritance among the Batak Toba migrant community in DIY and to describe the dynamic position of women in settlement of inheritance among the Toba Batak community who migrated to DIY. The research method in this research uses qualitative research. In determining the research subjects using purposive, based on the criteria, 6 research subjects were obtained, namely: Douglas Simanjuntak (HKBP church pastor), Masinton Marpaung (HKBP church secretary), Kalidangan Siregar, Darwin Samanda, Goodman Manulang, Eliana Miranda Yensi Pardede The data collection technique used interviews and documentation.

Research results show that; a. Settlement of Inheritance of Toba Batak Migrants in DIY; In settling inheritance in the Batak nomad environment. Even though in their daily lives the migrants still adhere to Toba Batak customs, in completing their family inheritance they are not completely the same as their ancestral customs. But there has also been a shift in this, which occurs when Batak men marry women from outside the Batak tribe, b. The Position of Women in the Inheritance System According to Batak Migrants; Batak migrants who have good education tend to have an open mind. They no longer view the concept of Batak Traditional inheritance with a narrow interpretation and think more contextually with the paradigm of gender equality and human rights. Girls can also inherit from their father.
