ABSTRACT

This community service program is conducted in the form of training to observe butterflies. Observations were made to be able to identify the butterflies up to the Type level. This training becomes important, highlighting the existence of the king butterfly (Troides helena) which is included in the protected butterfly species. The purpose of this training is to enable students to observe butterflies in the UNY campus environment, Train students using the butterfly identification guide during observation of butterflies in the UNY campus environment, the outcomes are reports of habitat observation and identification of butterfly species found during observation in the campus environment of UNY, Luaran in the form of research proposal of observation of butterfly in school that its students become participants of observation training in biology garden of FMIPA UNY. Prior to the training, the butterfly identification manual was compiled to be a medium for the training. Training was conducted in two different sessions.
