Validation of The Indonesia version Balanced Inventory Desirable Responding (BIDR-16) on Adult Subject

ABSTRACT

Response Bias or social desirability is a problem that is often encountered in social research that can affect the accuracy of the measurement results. One way to deal with response bias is to use an instrument to detect response bias. The Indonesian version of the Balanced Inventory of Desirable Responding (BIDR-16) can be an alternative instrument in detecting response bias in research. However, the development of the Indonesian version of BIDR-16 in 2021 and 2022 still has limitations on the characteristics of the respondents involved, which is still limited to students. Therefore, in 2023 this study was conducted with the aim of validating the Indonesian version of BIDR-16 in adult subjects. This study used research datasets in 2021 and 2022 involving 1364 adults in Indonesia. The results of Confirmatory Factor Analysis (CFA) found that the four-factor model was found to be more fit than the two-factor model that reinforces the findings in the previous study, while the reliability of BIDR-16 test results of adult subjects was found to be quite satisfactory
