FACTORS AFFECTING THE HEALTH & SAFETY CULTURE OF VOCATIONAL SCHOOL STUDENTS

ABSTRACT

The purpose of this study was to determine the factors that encourage and inhibit vocational school students to have a proper occupational health and safety culture. The research results are expected to be a reference for developing occupational health and safety learning to be more effective. This research was conducted at SMK N 2 Wonosari and SMK N 2 Pengasih. The subjects of this study were vocational students who were considered to have good attitudes in obeying occupational health and safety rules and also students who were considered less disciplined in practicum in school workshops. Assessment from fellow students is considered accurate to assess disciplined and less disciplined friends so that the first step in this study, after initial observation, is to capture students who will become research subjects. Students who enter as research subjects are interviewed to get important information in answering research questions. Observation of the learning process was carried out before conducting the interview to ensure that the research subject chosen was an appropriate and desirable source of information. Coordination with subject teachers and school principals was carried out before the observation took place. The results of the observations were used to triangulate the research data along with the results of the interviews.
