SOCIALIZATION OF LIBRARY COMPETENCIES AND PROFICIENCY OF HIGH SCHOOL INFORMATION LITERATION FOR PRIVATE HIGH SCHOOL AND VOCATIONAL SCHOOL LIBRARIAN IN YOGYAKARTA SPECIAL PROVINCE

ABSTRACT

The purpose of Community Service Program (PPM) is to socialize the Competency Standards for Users and the Standards for Information Literacy Skills. This information literacy skill supports users to become competent users according to the indicators described.

The socialization of these two standards needs to be conveyed to the librarians and teacher assistants/library supervisors so that they understand the indicator points that are relatively new to the Indonesian context. A total of 39 private SMK, MA and SMA teachers in Yogyakarta participated in this activity. Participants studied 231 standard indicators of user competency and 146 standard indicators of information literacy.

Of the three problem formulations that are given attention in this public service program, what can be achieved is how to make librarians and teachers of high school and private vocational libraries understand about librarian competence, high school library competence, and information competence of high school students. This is considering that the concept of these indicators is not well understood because Indonesia does not have these two standards. While the other two formulas have not been realized, namely 1) how to provide the experience of librarians and teachers of high school and private vocational libraries in order to be able to design the implementation of activities to increase self-competence as librarians, library users and student information competence in their respective schools?; and 2) how to provide the experience of librarians and teachers of high school and private vocational school libraries in order to be able to implement plans for activities to improve self-competence as librarian, library user competence and student information competence in each school?
