ANALYSIS OF QUESTIONS IN THE TRIAL IN THE STATE COURT

ABSTRACT

This research aims to reveal the various types, functions and purposes of questions asked in trials in district courts. The questions asked in the trial are very meaningful in determining the direction of communication and confirming it as a legal fact, as well as showing the existence of a power relationship. This research uses descriptive qualitative research methods. The data source in this research is the events of the Brigadier Joshua murder trial in the form of video recordings. The data collection technique used is the listening and note-taking technique. The data that had been transcribed was then analyzed using matching and agih data analysis techniques. The results of the research showed that there were four types of questions that arose in the trial of the murder case of Brigadier Joshua. First, Q-wh questions appeared 49.3% of the time, then the second question that appeared most frequently was declarative questions at 21.2%. Third, disjunctive questions with a percentage of 17.2%. Fourth, polar type questions with a percentage of 12.3%. In addition, it is known that the questions asked in the trial for the murder of Brigadier Josua had three purposes, namely agreement on the facts asked by the prosecutor, judge and lawyer, clarification of events, and confirmation of events that were and were not yet known.
