## Cross Pass Ethics of Students in Social Sciences Faculty Yogyakarta State University by Sugi Rahayu

## **ABSTRACT**

ABSTRACT Politeness in traffic is a portrait of personality that also describe the culture of the nation. This study aims to determine: 1) Ethics traffic of FIS UNY students, 2) type of traffic rule violation has ever done FIS UNY students, and 3) the ability of FIS UNY students identify the cause of the congestion that occurs as a result of not obeying traffic. This research is a descriptive study using a quantitative approach. The population and the samples are FIS UNY students who ride motorcycles in conducting its activities, the amount is not known. The number of FIS UNY students are 2856. If 50% of the students drive a motorcycle, the total population is 1478 people. The sampling technique used in this study is Proportionate Random Sampling. To determine the number of samples (minimum sample size) used the formula of Isaac and Michael for an error rate of 10% in order to obtain samples of 227, the real sample research is 193 people (85.2%). Data was collected through questionnaires, interviews, observation, and documentation. The data were analyzed descriptively both quantitative and qualitative. The results showed that: a) Traffic ethics of mostly students FIS UNY is good, although there still are students whose behavior have not reflected good traffic ethics. b) Some of the violations committed by the respondent, such as: 1) violates the road markings, 2) when the traffic light is yellow still accelerate the vehicle, 3) driving at speeds over 60 km/hour, 4) tandem more than 2 people, 5) use of communication tools (HP) to call/receive calls and writing/reading SMS/WA, 6) ran a red light and 7) to listen to music with HP/MP3 player while they drive, c) The age of respondents were between 17 and 23 years, which means they are still teens and early adulthood in which emotions were still unstable so easily provoked emotions that can cause accidents. Control of emotions along the way is a very important thing and started driving with prayer needs to be done. d) Ethics traffic train students to respect the rights of others, as well as identify the cause of the congestion that occurs as a result of not obeying traffic.
